2013 Morpheus Award Winner

Los Angeles, CA – March 4, 2013 – Once again, as all the golden statuettes have been handed out and Awards Season comes to an end in Hollywood, local security company Moore Protection (www.mooreprotection.net) has announced the winner of its annual Morpheus Award. This year's recipient is director and star Ben Affleck for his film Argo, which depicts the storming of the American embassy in Tehran and the escape and subsequent rescue of six American diplomats by a CIA exfiltration specialist, all posing as members of a Canadian film crew.
